

Pastor's Corner

Today is the feast of the Trinity. The Trinity, which speaks of God as three in one, seems on the surface to be a mathematical conundrum, a logical contradiction. At one level it is a reminder that God is beyond all our concepts and categories. Any idea or concept we have of God is not God. God is accessible not so much by understanding and ideas and concepts but through love and faith, through prayer and surrender. We speak a lot about God but ultimately we fall on our knees before the great mystery. We bow in worship rather than capture God in ideas.

On another level the Trinity tells us that our deepest belief about God is as a unity in diversity, a network of relationships. Our goal then is not so much to be right but to be in right relationship, not so much to be individually perfect as to be in communion. What we hope for is to belong to the communion of saints with God eternally. That is why we were baptized in the name of the Trinity and we begin all our prayers 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'.

Lucio Trinidad (The last name means trinity, by ironic coincidence!) has been our intern here for almost a year. It has been a joy to have him here in the community and his hard work, talents and dedication have been a blessing for us. We say good bye to him today as he returns to the seminary to continue his formation for priesthood which, please God, will be in two years. We will miss him and send him onward with our prayers and gratitude. Vaya con Dios Lucio.

REVELATION 1:8

THE MYSTERY OF THE HOLY TRINITY

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We say these words as we make the sign of the cross, the sign of God's saving love for us in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. God who created the heavens, earth, and all who dwell in it. Jesus Christ, through whom we are offered salvation and peace. The Holy Spirit, who breathes life, leads us to the truth, and strengthens us to live as God's holy people. On this Solemnity, let us pause to reflect upon the mystery of the Holy Trinity, three persons in one God. As we name the mystery, may we come to know God's love more deeply and live it more profoundly.

PERCEIVE WHAT CANNOT BE SEEN

Have you ever paused on a clear night to look up at the stars, or taken time to notice the splendor of spring flowers, the changing colors of the autumn leaves, or the still beauty of a snow-covered landscape? Such moments of quiet reflection may lead us to a powerful sense of wonder. The same God who created the stars, flowers, trees, and snow created each of us. In sensing God's presence in the beauty that surrounds us, we may be filled with awe in perceiving what cannot be seen. Moments of wonder and awe may take us by surprise. It may be invisible, yet in these moments we see the hand of God.

LOOK WITH EYES OF FAITH

Not only in the beauty of God's creation do we sense the presence of the Lord. In times of prayer, especially the celebration of the Eucharist, we are strengthened in faith to be assured of the mystery of the triune God. The Holy Spirit guides us to the truth—the truth of who God is and who we are in God's sight. Even in times of great trial, we endure and find hope in the mystery of Christ's love—Jesus, who gave his life for us on the cross and who rose in glory is with us in times of wonder and in moments of difficulty. We see the love of God in the acts of love of others and when we act as Christ's people in service and care for others. We grow in the capacity to see with the eyes of faith, eyes that recognize God's grace and are ready to respond by sharing the love of God, Father, Son, and Spirit, in the world.





|| Review boating safety measures before going on family vacation

If your family is planning a beach or lake vacation, it is time to review a few simple boating safety measures. Discuss these rules with your family before you go out on the water so everyone knows what is expected. Everyone should wear life jackets that fit them safely. Children should also be monitored for any signs of hypothermia, especially after playing in the water. Keep dry blankets, towels, and extra clothes on hand to change into if children are too cold. Parents should learn or refresh basic CPR and water rescue skills before vacation.
